


Common Medical Abbreviations

EKG: -

Electrocardiogram. Interprets electrical activity in the heart.

NWB:

Non-Weight Bearing. No weight is to be placed on the affected limb.



OR:

Operating Room. A sterile environment where surgeries are performed.

TPR & BP:

Temperature, Pulse, and Respiration & Blood Pressure. Vital signs measurements.



BS:

Blood Sugar or Breath Sounds. Measures glucose level or respiratory assessment, depending on the situation.



DDX:

Differential Diagnosis.
The process of
distinguishing between
two or more conditions.



CXR:

Chest X-Ray. An imaging test to view the lungs and heart.



SOB:

Shortness of Breath.

Difficulty in breathing.



CNS:

Central Nervous System. Made up of the brain and spinal cord.



ENT:

Ears, Nose, and Throat. A medical specialty focused on these areas.



IV:

Intravenous Therapy.
Delivering fluids or
medication directly
into a vein.



EHR:

Electronic Health Record. Digital version of a patient's paper chart.



EMT:

Emergency Medical Technician. Provides emergency medical care.



HR:

Heart Rate. The number of heartbeats per minute.





HGB:

Hemoglobin. A protein in red blood cells that carries oxygen.
